I can't believe it's May already, more than one person was heard to say last month and NOW lookout it's June!! "One" cannot remember time going at this rate when it was double Maths at school!

Excuse a personal question, but how do you get out of bed in the morning?? Do you leap up with a rush and a roar mindful of a full day ahead ---or do you pause, breathe slowly and say "This is the day that the Lord has made, we will rejoice and be glad in it"! Words from Psalm 118. We will not always feel like rejoicing, depending on our circumstances, BUT we can always rejoice in God's presence with us every moment of each day. There is much to be gained by pausing throughout the day and just "being". It is amazing the difference it makes to stop and take in our surroundings, whether it be at home with family pictures around us to prompt us to lift our loved ones up in prayer, or out in the stunning countryside where the beauty of God's creation causes us to be "lost in wonder, love and praise".

In the 19th Century William Longstaff, who was born in Sunderland, wrote a hymn with the first line "Take time to be holy, speak oft with the Lord " He went on to exalt us to "feed on His word" (the bible) to let "Jesus be our guide "and to "be calm in our soul" If that was the recommendation then how much more important is it today with all the busyness that seems to be around us?

A paraphrase from a prayer written in the mid 13th Century by Richard, Bishop of Chichester " Dear Lord , three things we pray. May we know you more clearly, love you more dearly and follow you more nearly day by day " praying for this to be so for each one of us. Perhaps we could enjoy a slow June by counting each moment, pausing often just to "be", revelling in the glory of creation and responding by thanking God for all His goodness to us.
