For most of us the Lord's Prayer is as familiar as the noses on our faces. We probably learned it as small children. We may well think that there is only one version. But stop a while and reflect.

Even in the white service booklets used in the churches and chapels in our Benefice, there are two versions – the contemporary and the traditional. The Church of Scotland version differs from ours ("forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors"), and the English Language Liturgical Consultation gives another ("save us from the time of trial"). Search the internet and you will find others as well.

What made me focus on the Lord's Prayer and look for various different versions? Pope Francis! Back in 2017 he spoke about the phrase "lead us not into temptation", a phrase that I know worries some people. Pope Francis said in that interview that he believed it should be altered. "It is not a good translation because it speaks of a God who induces temptation." He says later "It is Satan who leads us in to temptation – that's his department." Well change is now afoot in the Roman Catholic Church. In May the general assembly of the Episcopal Conference of Italy approved an alteration to that phrase to "do not let us fall into temptation". This is proving controversial in the Roman Catholic Church and in England there are no immediate plans to change the wording. Of course, it does not affect us in the Church of England. But what do you think about it? Would you like to see a change?
