#### **From the Rector:**

Dear All,

As I write, we are still in full lock down, with schools and businesses closed and all being encouraged to stay at home apart for essential travel, food shopping or exercise. How are you coping in this 'new normal'? I am sure the current situation is beginning to take its toll on your patience and possibly affecting your mental health but hopefully it is not influencing your physical health too. Relationships with those you live with will be challenged along with a deep yearning to be physically present with family or friends.

At this time we need to be encouraged by the message from Easter that Christ is risen and death has been conquered. The time of grief and mourning that the first disciples experienced turned to joy as he appeared to them in the upper room. Meeting with them on many occasions over a period of 40 days after his resurrection, he then ascended into heaven to be with God, his father and ours. Before leaving the disciples, Jesus promised them they would not be alone but should wait patiently for the Holy Spirit to come upon them, which he did in power a few days later. The book of Acts, especially Acts chapter 1, give the account of the coming of the Holy Spirit and the impact it had on the followers of Jesus.
